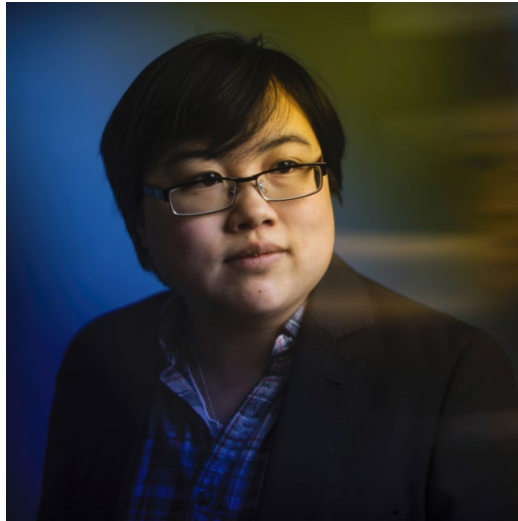


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Lydia X. Z. Brown: Self-Advocacy and Beyond Interviews with Leaders of the Self-Advocacy Movement



Lydia X. Z. Brown is a lawyer, advocate, organizer, and writer whose work has focused on violence against disabled people in schools, institutions, prisons, and by police. They have especially worked to support disabled people at many margins, including people of color with disabilities and LGBTQ+ people with disabilities. They have worked to transform systems and change the culture through community organizing, public speaking and peer training, policy advocacy, and challenging status quo.
